Such complaints must be filed within <u>thirty (30) days</u> after the person filing the complaint knew or reasonably should have known of the alleged violation.

Employees who believe they have been subjected to sexual harassment should <u>immediately</u> report the incident(s) to any manager or supervisor, notify the Department's Office of Equal Opportunity, their facility's OEEO Designee or contact the Office of the Statewide Equal Employment Opportunity Coordinator.

Persons requesting reasonable accommodations under the provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) should contact their agency's ADA Coordinator.
